Program Overview

According to CMS, at the end of the first quarter of 2009, over 6,400 residents living in Pennsylvania long term care facilities had a pressure ulcer. The consequences of pressure ulcers are serious: increased morbidity and mortality, as well as increased risk of pain, depression, and infection. The cost of treating pressure ulcers is staggering, and has been estimated to cost between \$2,000-40,000 to heal a single ulcer. Most pressure ulcers are avoidable, and fewer pressure ulcers indicate a higher quality of care. This session will provide information to assist facility staff in developing or strengthening a pressure ulcer prevention program, to reduce costs both in financial terms and human suffering.

Learning Objectives

Participants will learn how to:

- Describe the organizational practices necessary for a strong pressure ulcer prevention program.
- Recognize the significance of gathering and evaluating information pertaining to the period prior to admission.
- Demonstrate how to use at least one assessment tool to create a pressure ulcer prevention intervention plan.
- Relate potential regulatory consequences of an inadequate pressure ulcer prevention program.
